In last 5 months I took part in a project Boschi per la Biosfera determined to environmental education of children in elementary schools in Sicily, concretely in the area of Etna.

I personally took part in the educational part but at the same time I was responsible (with participation of other volunteers) for photo and video documentation, administration of the website www.terrebiosfera.org and creation of content on the [Facebook page](#) of Giacche Verdi Bronte.
